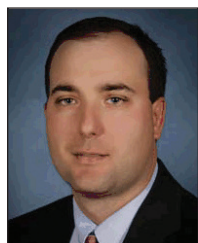

A Letter from the President



I can't believe it's already November. It has been a great experience serving as Club President. It's been a smooth year thanks to the hard work put in by the Club's management/staff and the many member volunteers serving the Club. Although, all members are never going to be in complete agreement over the policies and projects decided on,

you should be confident that the Club is well represented by members who are trying to make decisions for the long term benefit of the Club. As more clubs throughout the country have continued to close than open, our 98 year history shows how well our membership has been served through many economic changes in our region.

In October the Finance Committee and Board reviewed several capital projects proposed by our committees. We are in a very good financial position with our long term debt from the last major project on the golf course (irrigation) scheduled to be paid off next fall. We also feel confident that our short term debt incurred on the restaurant project will be paid by the 1st quarter of 2020. With that in mind, the Finance Committee and Board both agreed that it remains in the Club's best interest to wait on starting another major project prior to having more insight into 2020 membership levels and retiring the irrigation project debt.

I am pleased that the Board did approve moving forward on a recommendation from the Grounds Committee to make improvements to our driving range. The Board hopes to see dirt moving by the end of October with the completion of the project in November. This will give the grass time to grow and hopefully have the range reopened by early April. This project will improve the appearance of the golf course, improve the member experience at the range, and will not affect any long term plans that have been discussed regarding the holes around the range. We are also confident that the improved range will result in lower labor costs and the purchase of fewer range balls each year. Unlike many of the other projects presented to the Board, we expect that this will be completed without adding any additional long term debt.

We appreciate everyone who took the time to complete the membership survey. While surveys always provide insight into some areas that need improvement, the most recent Club survey indicated that member sentiment regarding our restaurant and golf course have improved over the past year. It also pointed out that we have some work to do regarding the member experience at the pool.

The survey is helpful as the Club makes plans for 2020.

As I conclude my last newsletter, I want to thank Stan, Club staff, and all of the other member volunteers in many different roles for all of their diligent work throughout the year. I encourage everyone to get involved at the Club through a committee or the board. Your eyes will be opened by the hard work that goes on each day to meet the expectations of our members. The Club is financially strong! The decisions over the past several years regarding member dues, capital improvement fund contributions, and the focus on reducing long term debt have ensured that the Club remains strong. Membership remains the primary concern for our Club and the overall country club industry. Like other clubs, our age demographics are tilted to the older end and research indicates that millennials are not playing as many rounds of golf per year and are not as likely to find value in a country club. Over the past several years, BCC has made major investments in the golf course, pool, and club house and has scheduled new social events to ensure that our Club remains vibrant for members. In 2020, the Board will start the process of finding a GM to replace Stan. The investments made over the last several years and the current financial condition of the Club should help attract strong candidates for the position.

In addition to the driving range project, there are many other activities at the Club in November. The popular Wine & Dine Brazilian Steakhouse is on Friday, Nov. 8 and we hope you will take time to attend the 98th Annual Stockholders meeting on Tuesday, Nov. 19. With the holiday season upon us, keep an eye out for information on the Thanksgiving Day Brunch and the Santa Brunch. Please don't forget to consider the Club for your upcoming holiday events. As always, I hope to see you at the Club soon. Don't hesitate to reach out with questions or concerns.

From the Manager's Desk



The holiday season is now upon us. This fall will be an exciting time at the Club will all the holiday activities inside and outside of the Clubhouse.

The Board has approved renovating the golf driving range. This project will consist of leveling the landing area of the range. You will be able to see your ball land at 150 yards. There will be three target greens at which to aim. Around 9000 cubic yards of dirt will be moved during this process. The actual work should take approximately three weeks. The driving range will be seeded and with Mother Nature's assistance we will be able to open the improved range in April 2020.

This project has been a much needed improvement in the golf course area. It is a small part of the Phase II golf course renovation project started in 2005 with Phase I completed at that time. Phase II consists of renovation of the driving range with leveling and new longer grass tees, new #7 and changing #8 fairway.

Moving forward with this leveling project will be a small step toward completing Phase II at some point in the future.

The new fall Membership Promotion is ongoing and remember the earlier someone take's advantage of the promotion the better the deal is for your new member! We have had eight new members join the Bellefonte family to date with many phones and contacts inquiring and interested.
